

Nurse Notes...HEALTH RECORDS required for next year!

Students entering grades listed below in the 2019-2020 school year will require health forms signed by your physician and/or dentist.

- Kindergarten - physical & dental exams, with updated immunizations
- 3rd grade - dental exam
- 6th grade - physical exam with updated immunizations
- 7th grade - dental exam
- 11th grade - physical exam with updated immunizations

By law in Pennsylvania, physical and dental exams are required 3 times during the school years. This timing correlates with periods of rapid growth and maturing.

Please send in completed forms by August 15, 2019 for review before the start of school. All forms can be printed from Renweb or your medical/dental office can use their forms.

\*Please also remember\* If your child requires any special medication during the school hours, you will need your child's physician to sign a Medication Dispensing Form every school year for that med. This order is required for any inhalers, Benadryl, Epipens, lactaid pills, special lotions or any antibiotics.

The school nurse has standing orders from the Central Bucks School District physician to administer basic first aid medications during the school day. This includes Neosporin, A&D ointment, Caladryl clear lotion for itchy skin or bug bites, visine eye drops during allergy seasons, antacids/tums and cough drops.

\*Please select "YES" for Permission to Treat to use the above standing orders, otherwise a phone call to parents will be made before any treatment which may require them being out of the classroom for a longer period of time.

\*Please also clarify "YES or NO" for Motrin and Tylenol doses to be administered if needed for headaches or injury pains, otherwise a phone call will be required before administering Tylenol (acetaminophin) or Motrin (ibuprofen) to your child if really needed. This is listed under OTC medications in Student's medical information in ParentsWeb (FACTS).
